INTRODUCTION

Disability Research and Capacity Development (DRD) was established on December 3rd, 2005 under the sponsorship of the Ford Foundation. DRD functions as a non-governmental and non-profit organization and is operated by and for people with disabilities.

DRD and the community are building a support model based on the rights of PWDs in an effort to promote equal opportunities for PWDs, encourage and create favorable conditions for PWDs to participate fully in all activities like other members in society.

Until now, the DRD has been supported over 3,500 PWDs in HCM City and a network of over 30 disability groups in the southern of Vietnam. 1 Vocational Training School of Southern Tay Ninh joined the journey of One World for All

On May 8th 2017, the Accessibility for Inclusion project by U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) had a visit to Vocational Training School of Southern Tay Ninh and organized the event ONE WORLD FOR ALL.

This was one of the most important activities of the project aiming to raise public awareness of disabilities, especially the difficulties faced by students with disabilities.

The event lasted for 150 minutes. During this time, stories told by guests gave students of the school a better insight into the difficulties that challenged students with disabilities: infrastructure is inaccessible for some types of disabilities, some subjects are not suitable for students with disabilities, study materials specified for those with visual impairments or hearing impairments are scarce, etc.

The event gathered over 200 people including students, administrators and teachers of the school.

In the discussion section, Mr. Nguyen Van Kieu, the headmaster of the school, said: "Since the Law on Persons with Disabilities went effective in 2011, there have been no guiding documents regarding how to practise the Law. We acknowledge that we haven't done enough for the sake of students with disabilities. Today's event has furthered my understanding of the difficulties that people with disabilities are facing. People with disabilities have human rights and deserve to be treated equally with those without disabilities ..."

2 25 staffs from Phu Cat District, Binh Dinh Province were trained on Equality and Integration for PWD

Under the project "Access for the Integration of People with Disabilities" - sponsored by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and Binh Dinh Department of Labor, War Invalids and Social Affairs, DRD organized a two-day training about "Equality and Integration for People with Disabilities" for 25 Social Protection Officers and People's Committee leaders of the communes of Phu Cat District, Binh Dinh Province. This training about "Equality and Integration for People with Disabilities" is one of the most important activities regarding the first objective of the project : to raise awareness of the community and people with disabilities and the rights of people with disabilities.

The training content was designed with a variety of activities, such as role play, painting analysis, short film analysis, group discussion, games, ... to help attendees participate and share, based on their work experience. From that, the trainer analyzed and provided relevant information such as: What is the integration? What rights do people with disabilities have? What can we do to create advantageous conditions for people with disabilities?

One participant shared: "When I was assigned to attend the training, I do not think that it will be fun but just like other trainings where I am just listening, reading, and copying. But after two days of training, I was surprised because I never attended this kind of training before. The training presented new contents, the trainers were very enthusiastic, the communication was very lively and everyone actively participated". Many people commented that: the communes are quite far away so people working in the same field have never met each other before. Thank you DRD for creating the

4 SAMCO responded the recommendations of DRD about bus number 71

DRD has issued a dispatch numbering 02/KN/DRD-IL/2017 dated April 14, 2017, on the proposed survey of access of people with disabilities on bus No. 71, bus line An Suong – Phat Co Don. This request has been sent to Saigon Transportation Engineering Corporation.

On 28/04/2017, Saigon Transportation Engineering Corporation (SAMCO) has responded to the DRD dispatch. Accordingly, SAMCO responded as follows:

After receiving the recommendation from DRD, we conducted a survey and reassessment of the disability framework on the SAMCO bus, and we found that the comments of DRD Center are perfectly reasonable.

Therefore, in order to improve wheelchair mobility for people with disabilities to better meet the customer needs, we offer the following solutions:

- In the near future, the model will be developed in the form of low floor for better accessibility for people with disabilities. However, SAMCO has encountered some difficulties:

- + The price of Chassis – the low floor is higher than high floor.
- + The standards or the road and the curb are not synchronized.
- + Tides and floods often occur.

So low floor buses are difficult to use, therefore they should be considered operating in some appropriate routes.

- For high floor vehicles, SAMCO will offer the most innovative solutions such as:

- + Proper seating arrangement
- + Handrails, hooks, and wheelchairs arrangement
- + Space allocation for wheelchairs is more appropriate.

5 Handover of Public Works in Quy Nhon City

On March 30, 2017, the Accessibility for Inclusion Project, in collaboration with Binh Dinh's Department of Labor, War Invalids and Social Affairs (DOLISA), organized the event celebrating the completion and hand-over of 05 public works with improvement categories for people with disabilities. Attending the hand-over ceremony were representatives from the DOLISA of Binh Dinh Province; representatives of the 05 units with improved accessibility works: the People's Committee of Quang Trung Ward, the People's Committee of Le Loi Ward, the Sponsor Association, the City General Hospital, Quy Nhon National High School, DRD representatives, Binh Dinh television and broadcast, Binh Dinh online' media correspondents.

At the ceremony, Mr. Truong Huy Vu reported the results of the renovation during the period from March 2, 2017 to March 29, 2017, to the delegates; Mr Truong said, "During the renovation time, the project has received support and cooperation from different units, which facilitates the construction process. However, the subjectivity

of the contractor had delayed the construction progress for 13 days .. "

At the end of the reporting program, Mr. Phan Dinh Hoa - Deputy Director of Binh Dinh DOLISA was delighted when he learned that the renovated works met the construction and aesthetic standards. Mr. Hoa said: " There has been no organizations that implemented these activities in Binh Dinh to create more benefits for people with disabilities, many agencies need to renovate so that more people with disabilities will get more convenience. There have been many construction projects, but so far none of the organizations showed interested in this aspect. "

Mr Bui Trung Dung - Quy Nhon City Sponsor Association for the Disabled and Orphans said: "I recognize that it is a very necessary and practical part of the project. We are a Sponsor Association working with PWDs using wheelchairs. When the ramp has been built at the entrance for the accessibility renovation, we found it beautiful and solid. During the construction of the project ,in fact we had made suggestions for adjustments on the drawing, and the project participants had listened and made changes. 6 Employment opportunities for people with disabilities at Land Talk company

8 Shares from students with disabilities who participate in the 55th Mindset-Based Transformation course

I am lucky to be given the opportunity to participate in the 55th Mindset-Based Transformation course on December 14, 15, 16, 2017 by DRD. For me, the course is really useful, I am very satisfied, and very happy. I've never been to such a good program, and it suits me well. During the three days' training, I have different emotions - sadness, happiness, sinfulness, and particularly, I have done one thing that I always thought it was not necessary to do. That is, saying love to my mother

From the very first training-day, I thought about my family deeply, my father passed away early, my mother has struggled to raise our siblings. However, I was too heartless, too reticent in the way I expressed love to my mother. I always wanted to hear her concern for me, to hear her saying: "I love you so much", but I have never thought that she would like to hear the same from me. It's the selfishness of myself. I cried a lot on that day, crying for my sin, crying for my happiness as I have realized the wrong. Subjective perseverance in thoughts would make me regret all my life. Fortunately, the program has promptly corrected me and from now on I will use both words and actions to express my feelings with my family.

The second day I came to the training-room with eagerness. And on that day, I realized that I needed to change if I wanted to live a better, meaningful life. I was once depressed about myself, when I was teased by my friends about my disability, I was very angry and once thought that why my mother did not kill me when I was just born in such a shape, but kept raising me to make people laugh at me? I regretted so much about that stupid thought and now I realize that the happiest gift of human-beings is to live.

I realized I had too many shortcomings, thinking negatively and stupidly. I loaded myself with more concepts in thought but what I realized the most profound was the concept of identifying oneself. I do not know that I have used this definition very successfully but with the opposite nature. Always thinking that I could not do it and let

2 Employment opportunities for people with disabilities at Land Talk company

1 -buffet-for-change – How will a buffet ticket contribute to make changes to the community? Especially for students with disabilities?

According to a survey conducted by the Ministry of Labor, Invalids and Social Affairs in 2007, less than 0.1% of people with disabilities (PWDs) graduated from colleges and universities. Besides barriers due to a lack of access of the majority of university environments, economic difficulties will create a important risk for students with disabilities, to have to stop school. Many students have stepped into the doorway of the University, but many have to give up their dreams because they cannot afford fee tuition and living expenses when living away from home.

With the belief that if the opportunity is given, people with disabilities (even the most serious ones) can become useful citizens who can build up an effective community, DRD launched a scholarship program named "Companion Fellowship Program" in April 2008. As of December 31, 2016, this Companion Fellowship Scholarship Program provided scholarships for 373 students. The students who graduated have sufficient expertise, skills and stable employment. Some of them even hold high positions in companies, they have happy families and have a certain position in society; for example, Le Minh Duy (Young Director of Cogini Vietnam), Nguyen Minh Hao (Project Manager of Anable Code Company), PhanThi Rat (Project Officer), Hoang Van Thu (Pharmedic Officer) ... as well as many other successful cases.

One scholarship has made a lot of positive changes for youth with disabilities so that they will not only be able to achieve their dream, but also continue this beautiful journey by sharing with other children with disabilities.

DRD wants to call on the community to work together to create more meaningful scholarships.

Hòa, member of Phúc Trìu Commune's Association of People with Disabilities, under Thái Nguyên City, said.

2 Job fair held for people with disabilities

Some 230 labourers have been hired for work and 340 for vocational training during a job fair for people with disabilities (PWD) held in Hà Nội yesterday.

Held on the occasion of the Vietnamese People with Disabilities Day (April 18), the event attracted some 1,000 participants and 61 enterprises, as well as members of the Hà Nội Disabled People Association and blind associations of the city's districts.

Products made by disabled people were displayed and promoted at several booths at the fair.

Workshops on taking care of disabled people's physical and mental health, on business models for disabled people, as well as on the national policies and regulations related to disabled people, were held at the fair.

Also, a festival was held in conjunction with the fair on the occasion of the 45th anniversary of the Hà Nội Blind Association.

Additionally, two collectives and 32 individuals were honored at the festival for their achievements in the fields of community service, production, arts and culture, study, and applied information technology.

Several activities were organised at the festival for participants to experience the life of blind people in order to encourage empathy from society for blind people, in particular, and disabled people, in general.

Hoàng Mạnh Cường, president of Đông Anh District's blind association, said the festival had created opportunities for members of the association to connect with the community.

Each type of disabilities has its own particularity that requires further attention, study and understanding from society, in order to provide disabled people with proper care and support, he said.
